	2. Making a Sandwich	Supplies to make a sandwich.	Ask your child to tell you each step for making a sandwich. (do each step literally. Ex if the child says put them jam on the bread, then you put the jar of jam on the bread) The	

			child may need some help from you to figure out the proper words.	
Physical Education	1. Freeze Dance	Music (tv, radio, computer, phone)	Play music and start moving and dancing. When the music stops, freeze like a statue and don't move until the music starts again.	
	2. The Floor is Lava		This game can be played inside and outside. The rule is simple: the ground/floor is lava, don't step on it. You can put items on the floor to step on (blankets, paper, clothes, chairs)	
Arts	1. Animals Sounds	Pictures of animals	Brainstorm animals with your child and find or make pictures of them. Then place down the animal's pictures on the ground and create a path to follow. Have your child go along the path and once they reach an animal, make the sound of that animal. You can use your own language for the animals.
