	2. Sock Puppet Show	Socks	Put a sock on your hand and a sock on your child's hand. Have your "puppets" talk to one another.	
Numeracy	1. Match the Lid	Plastic containers and lids, or pots and pans	Grab some containers or pots and place them on the table with all the lids. Encourage your child to match the lid that fits to the container.	
	2. How tall am I?	Measuring tape, ruler or pencil	Using a measuring device, have your child measure how tall they are (ex. If you don't have a ruler, have them use a pencil and move it up their body to see how many pencils tall they are). Then they can measure other people/pets in the house.	

<b>Curiosity (Science)</b>	1. What's in the Bag?	A bag, any random objects from around the house.	Take an object and put it in a bag (without your child seeing). Have them put their hand in the bag and try to guess what it is they are feeling.	
	2. Leaf Pounding	Wood, Fabric, Leaves	Take a leaf and put it on a flat piece of wood. Place a piece of fabric over top. Take another piece of wood and pound where the leaf is. <b>Social - Emotional</b>	1. Group Pinball	A ball or balloon	Sit on the floor with legs out and pass a ball back and forth without stopping. 	2. Understanding emotions	A storybook	While reading a story pause and ask your child how they think the character is feeling and why.

<b>Self-Help/Adaptive</b>	2. Cooking in the Kitchen	A favourite recipe and ingredients	Gather all the ingredients and encourage children to help pour, mix and spread while making the recipe. Enjoy eating together after cooking!

	2. Obstacle Course	Things found around the house (ex. Tables, chairs)	Create an obstacle course inside or outside using everyday objects. Ex. crawl under the table, hop around a chair, spin in a circle, walk backwards from one room to another	
<b>Creativity</b>	1. Nature Soup Creation	Items found outside (ex. dirt, rocks, pine cones) ,old large cooking pot, pan or container, sticks, old cooking utensils	Children can create a make believe soup inside an old cooking pot or container. Children can collect items to make their soup and name it.	
	2. Create a Story	Paper and crayons (if drawing)	Children can make a story up about themselves or their family members. Children can draw or talk about their story to others.	
<b>Spiritual</b>	1. Spring animals	List of spring animals, pictures of spring animals	Ask children to sit with you and discuss spring animals. Name and say	

<b>Spiritual</b>			the sound of the animal. Ask children about the animal and where the animal lives	
	2. Make Bannock	Bannock recipe, oil or lard, salt, flour, baking powder, water, mixing bowl, and a baking tray	Ask children to help you make bannock. Children can help mix the ingredients. Children can count the ingredients as they are pouring and mixing. 	2. Name that dish	Dirty dishes	When going to wash each dish or load the dishwasher, hold it up and ask your child what is it?
